Norton Radstock Classic Vehicle Club (NRCVC) Policy Statement

Policy statement for members and guests taking part, attending events, shows, runs and displays organised by the NRCVC or participating in as members of the NRCVC.

- All vehicles must be in a safe roadworthy condition
- All drivers must have an appropriate current recognised driving licence for the vehicle being driven. The details on which must be in English
- All vehicles must be insured to comply with the current Road Traffic Act and for the purpose of attending and participating in NRCVC events. The insurance details must be made available to the NRCVC on request and for event organisers if requested. The NRCVC recommends that members have their insurance details with them when taking part in organised events.
- When travelling to or from organised events the members should comply with all UK Road Traffic laws, rules and regulations as deemed necessary for their vehicles.
- All vehicles will have a current VOSA/MOT test certificate where appropriate for the vehicle. The NRCVC reserves the right to inspect these.
- When on an event site members will comply with the rules specified by the organisers of the said event.
- Safety in use of the vehicles will be first priority for all members at events to protect the public, other road users, property, vehicles and members.
- When the NRCVC members' vehicles are on display at an organised event the vehicles are to be supervised at all times. It will be the responsibility of members attending to ensure that vehicles are not left unsupervised.
- On arrival at events it is the members' responsibility to assess the site and identify any hazards and make provision to prevent harm to the public, property, members and vehicles.
- Spare fuel, oil and hazardous liquids must be contained in appropriate containers, which are fit for purpose. No members should carry more than 20 litres of spare fuel. The NRCVC does not recommend carrying additional fuel and members should avoid the need to do so.
- Members should have concern for the environment and avoid creating unnecessary fumes and noise when using their vehicles. Leaving vehicles running on site for excessive periods is not endorsed by the NRCVC.
- The NRCVC recommends that members should carry in their vehicles, when attending events, a first aid kit, a fire extinguisher, a high visibility tabard, a warning triangle and service maintenance spares.
- The NRCVC accepts no responsibility for the actions or conduct of members attending events, but promotes a policy of shared interest, enjoyment and promotion of the Club.
